Application process FAQ

Below you find a few frequently asked questions concerning the application process. Be sure to follow our Facebook Page for further information. Sign up for our information meetings at various Danish universities in order not to miss important information about DBI 2017.

Who are we looking for?

Our main focus is talented and ambitious students from all Danish Universities, studying economics, business, political science, engineering, science, law and alike. Preferably you are on the first or second year of your masters, but extraordinary bachelor students can apply as well.

What are the requirements?

- ✓ You have to be a student at a Danish University, alternatively a Dane studying abroad
- ✓ You have to be able to participate in the full trip as well as the pre- and post-seminar
- ✓ You are interested in Novozymes and/or The Boston Consulting Group
- ✓ You are able to communicate in English it is used on the seminars and the trip
- ✓ You have to be a member of Djøf (or IDA if you are an engineer) if invited to the trip

How do we evaluate the applications?

We evaluate the applications with regards to the motivational essay, grades, extracurricular activities and fit to DBI and our sponsor companies. In the motivational essay we would like to hear about your experience and ambitions and why you think you fit into the DBI 2017 team.

Do I need case experience?

No! A part of the trip will be a 24h case, concerning the present challenges for Novozymes in a local market. However, no previous case experience is required to participate in the trip. With that being said, being experienced in case solving definitely doesn't make you worse off when applying for DBI 2017.

Who pays for the trip?

DBI is sponsored by Djøf, Novozymes and The Boston Consulting Group as well as various scholarships. This is however not enough to cover all the costs and each participant must contribute as well. The contribution this year will be 6500 DKK. This includes flights, accommodation and some of the meals, but excludes insurance and personal allowance.

When is DBI?

DBI begins with a pre-seminar weekend 17-18 March 2017. The trip to Japan is from April 10 to April 24, 2017. The case competition finale/post-seminar will be held May 5 in Copenhagen. Attendance in all of the above mentioned events is compulsory.

How do I apply?

You apply online by uploading the following documents:

- ✓ Motivational Essay (max 1 page)
- ✓ CV (max 1 page)
- ✓ Grade Transcripts

Please do not upload any further documents.

The online application system is easy to go about and the application will be done in three steps:

- Step1: Fill out personal information as well as information about education, GPA etc.
- Step 2: Upload the three documents mentioned above separately.
- Step 3: Send your application by confirming. You will now receive a confirmation email.

You can start applying for DBI 2017 from October 31, 2016, at 18.00

When is the application deadline?

The application deadline is December 5, 2016 at midnight.

Applications received later will not be reviewed. Applications received through e-mail or in any other way than through the online application system will not be reviewed either.

What happens after the application deadline?

We will review the applications and select 30 participants in collaboration with Novozymes and The Boston Consulting Group. No interviews will be held. You will get an answer no later than January 2, 2017.
